



THE NON FUTURE OF VILLAGE VOICE

Following the very disappointing response to the questionnaire that was included with the September issue of the Village Voice it now leaves the future of this great monthly magazine in doubt

From the 2500 properties that Village Voice is to only 114 questionnaires were returned. (13 of these with NO contact details). Also from the 114 only one person showed any interest in finding out whether they could help, but after further thought they have said no. The returns equates to a 4.5% response and this sadly reflects on how difficult or if not impossible to get anyone to come forward and help with anything in our community today.

As was said previously Brian Swan has been editing the Village Voice for over four years but also been responsible for gathering the advertising revenue that supports the monthly print, two other board members have played a small part in keeping it going.

No one person can continue this task for ever and it is quite amazing that there is no one else in the community of Fritton and St Olaves, Burgh Castle or Belton who has the skills, or is willing to learn, to take over the editorship for a few years. The Village Voice board has been trying for the last 18 months to get one or two people interested so that this great magazine could keep going.

With all that has been tried and without success it is sad to say that after 16 years the Village Voice will not be able to be produced from the beginning of 2016, that is UNLESS WE GET SOME SERIOUS OFFERS VERY SOON.

The Board thanks all who have helped in different ways, especially all the advertisers and not least all who have helped with the monthly deliveries around the area.

NEW LINK ROAD

We now appear to have lost the workmen on the actual carriageway of the A143 near the new roundabout although there is still a little clearing up on some of the edges, drivers should be aware that there are now permanent 30MPH restriction in all directions approaching the roundabout.

Anybody hoping to try out the new link will be disappointed, we took a drive down on a quiet Sunday morning last week, as far as the next roundabout is all but finished and it is necessary to pass the Browston lane entrance, drive round that roundabout and come back to drive towards Browston as there is no right turn off the road.

Carrying on along the new road it was possible to get as far, with care, as all the top layers of tarmac are not laid yet, to just abreast of the start of the Beacon Park warehouses there is then what looks to be a short section that we could not pass although no doubt on foot this would have been possible, just how long it will be before we can use the whole road is a good question, November, only next month, was talked about at some time, so it is just a case of wait and see and there is also talk of buses on that road from January next.

Although the whole road is not very wide it does appear that the pathway on the northern side is wide enough for cyclists as well and travelling along you get good views of the first of all those new houses that are springing up at such an alarming rate.

Fern Gardens Shrubs

Having lived in Fern Gardens since its development, of almost thirty years, I have seen a great many changes during this time. It is with great disappointment that I now discover that it is not the friendliest neighbourhood it once was.

A recently bereaved family planted shrubs as a memorial of the happy times spent by a family member in Fern Gardens. I am told that when enquiries were made for the planting the Borough Council originally stated that "there was no problem planting on this grassy area provided the grass cutters still had easy access and the shrubs were maintained." I now hear that a complaint was made from resident(s) on Fern Gardens to the the Borough Council and a decision to remove the shrubs was taken.

I happen to overlook the area where the shrubs were planted and I was very happy to have a view of these plants as opposed to the cars and vans which use this space as a parking area, this hampers other drivers in negotiating a steep curve in the road and damage to the grass verge and possibly other vehicles and , at times, stops an even flow of traffic. In my view this parking is not used in consideration of other residents/drivers.

Every house built in Fern Gardens was provided with car parking space at the rear of the property or on a base in the garden. I believe I am the only person in my terrace of houses using this facility. Other residents appear to park on the roadside. I am very aware that families have more than one vehicle and this causes huge problems. When this "estate" was built it was to be an open plan green development.

In conclusion the Parish Council has made much effort in enhancing the village as a whole with the planting of flower

beds and shrubs which helps to "soften" the roadside from brick buildings and wooden fences. I am hopeful for a happier outcome of this incident and that the Parish Council and residents of Fern Gardens look to amicably resolve this issue.

They phoned their boss, and I was able to speak to him (John Cotton) he said he understood why we did it but it was against the law, and had to come out but he has answered an e-mail I sent him, and has suggested we ask our Village Council to try to get permission to have flower beds with flower's and bulbs, on the grounds of being dangerous to let cars park on there.

So we are hoping this can come about soon, please Village Councillors can you HELP US !!!!!

BEING AN OLDER DRIVER

Age Concern at Yarmouth have arranged with Norfolk County Council for older drivers to have an assessment of their driving skills, this is called "Gold Guidance for Older Drivers". You can arrange to have your driving checked be an independent observer by calling the County Council on 0344 800 8020, or e-mail roadsafety@norfolk.gov.uk. The cost is £29 – not cheap but a good investment. This is not a driving test, no questions on the Highway Code.

I took this assessment in September, there is nothing to worry about, you drive your own car, the assessor just asks about the type of

driving that you do. We drove round Gorleston for about 45 minutes, as the drive progressed the assessor made notes, when we arrived back in Belton I was given a "Drivers Development" form, with remarks about my driving.

I am happy to report that I passed on everything with good comments which boosted my confidence. The test was well worth taking and I recommend that all older drivers "have a go".

When you phone the County Council the date will be agreed and the assessor will come to your home at the appointed time.

“REMEMBRANCE”

It has been my privilege to play “The Last Post” in Remembrance Day Services at Belton Church and Burgh Castle Church for the last couple of years. Personally, I always find the services very moving, particularly when the words are read,

“They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old:
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and in the morning
We will remember them.”

(From “For the Fallen” by Robert Laurence Binyon)

I find this so moving as I remember my father who served in the RAF and my uncle, who was a prisoner of war in Japan. Both have now passed away but both were deeply affected by what happened in those war years. Neither spoke about their experiences, but the effect on them was apparent, in different ways.

My father spent almost every evening, for all of the years I knew him as I grew up and throughout my adult life, at the RAFA; the club for ex-servicemen, although no-one there ever spoke about the war. On one occasion however he did tell me that he found it very difficult to talk about “a God who would let things like that happen to my friends...”

He knew of course that none of this was God’s fault; war is caused by men. And he always had a well-worn bible on his

dressing table. I also prayed with him in his last days. He lost a brother in the war, as did my mother. He never missed the Remembrance Day March in my home town. He always wore his medals, and then put them away in the drawer in the bedroom straight after. He wasn’t proud, and I think he wore them for the friends he lost.

My uncle was a solitary figure. He lived alone all his life, had no wife or children. He never ventured very far and spoke very little if he spoke at all. My mother told me that before the war he was “the life and soul of the party, but after he came back he was as thin as a rake, weighed about 5 stone, and was a totally different person...”

I see the Remembrance Day Service as a time to reflect on the awful tragedy of war and the damage it causes to so many. I have uncles I have never met as they were killed before their time. Cousins who were never born I suppose.

Despite all of this there are still wars and still the tragedy of lost lives and unborn children “who might have been.” At this time my prayer is that God will raise up leaders in all nations who will have the wit, the wisdom and the courage to lead their nations into times of peace.

Earlier this year I launched "My Plan for Great Yarmouth." This set of priorities for our area over the next five years, was based upon the views of thousands of local residents in answer to my frequent opinion surveys, or expressed in the correspondence I receive as Member of Parliament. Extending free car parking in the town centre, was a clear requirement for many.

I am delighted that Conservative councillors listened to that demand and responded to my lobbying on behalf of residents. The free parking trial in six town centre car parks is already proving extremely popular. Let's hope that during the run up to Christmas, this will encourage more people to shop locally, rather than travel further afield for their festive shopping. Every town centre has faced significant challenges over the last decade, as more of us were attracted by online shopping. Discouraging shoppers with an unnecessary parking charge was just another obstacle. SEPTEMBER 15TH COUNCIL MEETING

Due to other meetings, illness and holidays only six councillors were able to attend the second September meeting of Belton with Browston Parish Council, John Rudrum was in the chair.

Members discussed parking at the New Road Sports Centre, they are concerned about vehicles being parked outside the property by the fence, and

agreed to obtain quotations to extend the car park as far along the frontage of the field as is possible - up to the cricket nets, this should give over 30 more hard surface places.

The County Council are again offering their Parish Partnership funding scheme in 2015/16, this pays half the cost of approved highways related schemes, with approximate figures of £3/£4K for flashing warning lights to assist the school crossing patrol person on Bracon Road and £3.5K

as the cost of a 2 metre wide "Trod", a compressed footpath and brambles clearance between Waveney Drive and Ranworth Close on New Road members agreed to progress both schemes to formal quotes and application, it is also hoped that the two Borough Councillors will contribute some of the cost from their Ward Budgets, they each have £2K to allocate in this financial year.

Members agreed to look at alternative contractors to

undertake the PACT electrical testing at New Road and also to price the cost of advertising leaflets for the New Road Centre.

The Borough planners had replied to the councils concerns over their approval of planning permission for stable and storage over at Lochinvar, Short Road, Browston and confirmed that no permission for residential use on the first floor would be given without a further formal planning application.

OCTOBER 6TH COUNCIL MEETING

Again other commitments and illness restricted the first October meeting of Belton with Browston Parish Council attendance to just seven members plus County Councillor Colin Aldred, Borough Councillor Adrian Myers and one member of the public, John Rudrum was in the chair.

Councillor Greenacre reported on a major sewage leak on St Johns Road the previous day but commented on the excellent speed of the response from Anglian Water and said that their environmental officers were due to check the Stepshort Dyke where the

effluent had flowed to.

Borough Councillor Myers is to write to Tesco and other shops at the precinct to complain about delivery lorries arriving long before 7.00am and leaving engines running as well as their parking in that area at school arrival time, he is also going to investigate the possibility, for safety reasons, of a one way system through the car park there although it was pointed out that this is privately owned by the shopkeepers and their landlords. County Councillor Aldred was asked to contact the relevant department at County Hall and request that they clean up the garden at the former school caretakers bungalow, this was reported to be a "total mess". There was a letter from a resident about the removal by

the Borough or County Council of some shrubs planted in Fern Gardens in memory of a former resident, It was pointed out that there are strict criteria that have to be followed in obtaining a planting licence and some councillors felt the corner in question might not meet these however members would be willing to forward a request for a planting licence to Norfolk County Council for a decision provided there was a commitment from the applicant(s) to maintain any area allocated.

The chairman reported that the SAM2 speeding signs had been relocated during the day, there are six locations, each with permission for both directions to be used for the two units available in the village and they must be

rotated on a monthly basis.

Members discussed four quotations to extend the New Road Sports Centre car park - it can only go towards the cricket nets as extending outwards into the grass would encroach too much on the space needed for the football pitches, a quotation from Folkes Plant and Aggregates was accepted for the work, a further quotation from R&R Trees was accepted to reshape all the trees on the field by cutting away the lower branches, this is something that is needed to encourage better growth it will also improve access for grass cutting and allow the grass to develop better.

Belton with Browston Parish Council holds twice monthly meetings at the at the New Road Sport & Leisure Centre, Belton on the first and third Tuesday of each month (7.30pm). The next dates are November 3rd and 17th and December 1st. All council meetings are open to the public and questions can be put to councillors during the first 15 minutes of each meeting (normally restricted to one question per member of the public present).

ENTUA (East Norfolk Transport Users Association) is a voluntary independent body which monitors bus and rail provision in the East Norfolk Area. Please visit our web site www.entua.org.uk.

ENTUA officers met with representatives from National Express at the beginning of October, they are one of the three short-listed bidders for the Greater Anglia rail franchise. National Express had sight of our submission to the Department for Transport (as all bidders have) and wanted to go through our list of aspirations. After going through our list and hearing our views, we settled on three priorities from our point of view.

1. A complete revamp of Great Yarmouth Vauxhall Station including a completely closed-in concourse protected from the elements, with glazed doorway access to the platforms, access to toilets at all times with the station staffed beyond 5.30 pm. Additional seating and decorated to a standard that is comfortable and welcoming.

2. Direct train services to Cambridge (then eventually to Stansted Airport). Currently Yarmouth to Stansted involves three trains/two changes. This puts potential passengers

off using the train as an option. A direct service from Yarmouth – Stansted would mean loading cases once on and once off and avoiding paying for car parks at Stansted.

3. Bus links to Rail Station. In the 21st century we should have joined up public transport services. For potential passengers (those who currently drive everywhere) to change to using public transport it has to be made as convenient and as simple as possible – walking with suitcases from Market Gates or Stonecutters Way to the station is just not appealing. Every effort has been made to bring the road bridge at Vauxhall Station back into full use to enable buses travelling from Gorleston to Market Gates access to the station. A very successful bus service (No 3) operates to the station in the summer (May- September) but there needs to be frequent services all the year round.

The news that Anglian bus are proposing some radical changes in their timetables from 2nd November has come as a real surprise to us at ENTUA and as a shock to those passengers who depend entirely on Anglian buses to get to work.

Firstly Service 81 operating between Great Yarmouth to Beccles and Diss (as Service 80) This is being reduced from eleven to six buses each way per day. It is essentially going to become a two-hour frequency.

Secondly Service 61 operating from Kessingland and Southwold to Great Yarmouth where it becomes Service 7 is changing. From 2nd November Service 7 will operate from

Lowestoft to Norwich via Great Yarmouth on a ½ hour frequency (not 20 minute frequency as now) Mon-Sat but there will be no Sunday or Bank Holiday service. From this date the service will cease to

operate along Middleton Road but instead will operate along Lowestoft Road and Avondale Road North of the James Paget Hospital and then James Paget Hospital, Mariners Compass south of the James Paget Hospital then to Lowestoft.

Service 61 will operate from Lowestoft to Kessingland on a 20-minute frequency with every third bus going to Southwold via Wangford – Mon-Sat. On Sundays and Bank Holidays there will be an hourly service from Lowestoft to Kessingland with every other bus going through to Southwold.

Thirdly Service 60 which currently operates between Beccles and James Paget Hospital with six journeys each way going via Blundeston and Lound Mon-Sat is being withdrawn. In its place will be a 60J service operating three journeys each way between Lowestoft and James Paget Hospital via Blundeston and

Lound Mon-Sat. Clearly these reductions in service are a blow to those who depend upon public transport to get about, but as you probably know most bus services are operated by private companies with little or zero subsidies from County Councils. Services 60 and 80/81 have not been attracting enough passengers to make them commercially viable and hence the company are cutting their losses.

Equally a two-hour frequency, as will be the case of Service 81, will not instil confidence with bus passengers.

We can only hope that First Eastern Counties are not faced with the same dilemma over any of their loss-making routes. If you would like to become a member of ENTUA and help us campaign for improvements and retention of local bus and rail services, please join us. 

DOWN THE GARDEN PATH

Here are a few things to do on good (sunny!) winter days.

- 1. Gather fallen leaves** and stack to make leafmould. Make a home for wildlife especially hedgehogs which have sadly diminished in large numbers over the last few years.
- 2. Tidy the borders** and loosen the soil with the hoe. Make sure to get rid of weeds especially chickweed, groundsel and bittercress as these will germinate during warmer days and spread their seed around causing trouble in the spring.
- 3. Erect protective windbreaks** of sacking or stout polythene round newly planted shrubs such as choisyas, cistus and garryas which are tender when young.
- 4. Continue** to plant container grown shrubs. Make sure you have enough berrying shrubs for the birds. Here are a just a few Berberis darwinii, Callicarpa bodinieri 'Profusion', Cotoneaster, Pyracantha, Skimmia, Viburnum and of course Ilex (holly)
- 5. Now** is a good time to plant or repair a hedge.
- 6. If we have an extended autumn** mow the grass with the blades of the mower set high. Clean all equipment and book the mower for a winter service. Get it done now rather than leave it till the spring when everyone is busy. Coat the blades with a little cooking oil to ensure they do not develop any rust.
- 7. Vases of beautiful chrysanthemums** can quickly become off putting when they start to smell rank unless the water is changed frequently. Let's face it not all of us have the time to mess around with vases of flowers on a daily basis. The smell, in fact I would say stink, is caused by a quick buildup of bacteria in the water and chrysanthemums seem to suffer more than most. A tip I learnt quite recently is to place a few drops of household bleach in the vase before adding the water. This seems to work wonders and does the flowers no harm.
- 8. Think ahead** can the garden be improved in any way? Can it be made easier to manage? Could it be made more interesting? How about adding a focal point! Now is the time to plan and make alterations. A job for indoors with pen and paper. No garden large or small should be a burden to its owner. Happy Gardening.

ORMISTON JAMES PAGET PROJECT

Students from Ormiston Venture Academy have been working with students from Cliff Park Ormiston Academy and local historians to complete an interactive exhibition about the life and times of Sir James Paget. Zak Buttifant, Cameron Robinson, Ryan Nicol, Kain McBarron and Paige Lovick have worked over 6 months to research, design and bring together the final exhibition. Sir James Paget was a surgeon and lived in 1800s Great Yarmouth and London, even becoming royal physician in his illustrious career. As part of their initial research, the students went on trips that included visiting Lacons Brewery, James Paget Hospital and the Time and Tide Museum.

The project culminated in a Dragons Den style ideas workshop for an interactive display on the man himself, as well as conditions in Victorian Great Yarmouth. Tuesday 7th July saw the grand opening of the exhibition at Great Yarmouth library where the public went along and viewed (and interact with) the efforts of the Ormiston Venture and Cliff Park Ormiston students until the end of July.

Somehow, museum display designer Jeremy Moore took the 'Box of Shocks' display from a drawing on a piece of paper to the wonderful interactive spectacle you could view in the exhibition. You were also able to see the 'Amputation Station' and see how difficult it is to amputate a hand against the clock. Nexus engineering really helped to build this exhibit. Also a 3D print of Sir James Paget as part of 'Paget's Picnic', built at Cliff Park by the students and DT teacher Bob Groome; where students have dreamed up a picnic between Sir James and some of his contemporaries. The students recorded sound bites as Charles Darwin and Florence Nightingale among others, all of who worked with Great Yarmouth's most famous surgeon.

The students even had the pleasure of meeting Sir Julian Paget, Great Grandson of Sir James, who was very impressed with the exhibits.

Any one of these would have been pride of place at the interactive exhibition, but to have all three-in such a short space of time-is truly staggering. The exhibition was a really is a worthwhile trip to Great Yarmouth library, where information about the conditions James grew up in and his contribution to medicine. The exhibition spent some time in the Great Yarmouth Minister during the summer holidays and then also spent a week at Ormiston Venture Academy in September for the rest of the academy to appreciate.

As part of our involvement with Heritage Schools and Historic England, OVA has been awarded Heritage Schools status. This award was accepted on behalf of the Academy by Kain McBarron during the exhibition launch.



BURGH CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

There were six Parish Councillors, County Councillor Alan Grey and nine members of the public at the October meeting of Burgh Castle Parish Council, Trevor Greenacre was in the chair.

A resident raised concerns that permission had been granted for a dropped kerb/ vehicle access for a property near to the village sign on Butt Lane although the chairman said he felt their was sufficient clearance.

The County Councillor said that he had not had any reports back from County Highways over his complaint about the condition of Mill Road and Stepshort which he had submitted after last months meeting. Councillor Grey did report that there are exploratory enquiries being made at the County Council to see if it can become policy that there is a 20mph speed limit outside the main entrances to all schools in the county.

There was one planning application, revised plans for plot 4 at the new

development on Butt Lane, changes were minor so there were no objections and the developer was complimented about making his application before work commenced.

There was no news on the Broads Authority Landscape partnership Scheme for Breydon Water marshes although it was stated that the Heritage Lottery Fund are meeting during October and there could be news on possible funding in time for the November meeting.

There was a long discussion over dogs being kept under control after a parent had complained about a young child being upset by a dog not on a lead on the Roman Fort site, there were concerns that the Archaeological Trust who own the site had relaxed rules over the need for leads but it was emphasised that it is the dog owners who are responsible for keeping full control of their animals. There were suggestions from some members that either the Borough Council Rangers should be advised about the problem or the that the Parish should look to have its own community dog wardens.

FURSEY PILGRIMAGE

Wonderful weather welcomed the Norwich based "Fursey Pilgrims" for their 19th Annual Pilgrimage to Burgh Castle on October 3rd. Canon David Abraham, founding father of the group has this year stood down and the new leader is Dr Gudrun Warren, Cathedral Librarian. Visitors came from across the eastern region and

Those able to walk then made their way to the Roman Fort for a short Act of Worship at what is believed to be the site of Fursey's monastery. The afternoon drew to a close with afternoon

BRADWELL PARISH COUNCIL

The council's Amenities & Highways Committee has received from Gt Yarmouth Borough Council a revised 'Parish Consultation' regarding a number of proposals made locally further to the 'Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act' having been enacted in Spring 2014. FRITTON & ST. OLAVES PARISH COUNCIL

Eight Parish Councillors along with County councillor Colin Aldred and Borough Councillor Adrian Myers attended the July meeting of the Council, Allan Mendum was in the chair

There had been a satisfactory clean up of Waveney Forest and Tinks Wood by the Community Payback unit, Borough Councillor Myers had received approval for the flyers he had prepared against parking on New Road and would have them printed along with some laminated larger versions to be displayed.

No further update had been received from Anglian Water in regard to the chairman's letter pointing out that the approval of the new camping site facilities at Fritton Lake will put even more pressure on the system and the pumping station. Cllr Adrian Myers reported that he hoped the dossier he was preparing on various sewage problems would be finished within the next two of weeks and Councillor Youngs reported two more overflows at the Dell Pumping Station on the 4th and 8th July, one of these overflows was caused through a storm.

Cllr Jill Rose suggested, that there may be some building development taking place towards the top of New Road, Fritton, however no one seemed to be aware of this matter despite enquiries being made.

The yearly accounts for audit had been finalised and sent to the external auditors for approval for the year ending 31st March 2015.

Borough Cllr Adrian Myers discussed the latest ward budget proposals and their return, he asked for idea's on how this money could be spent in Fritton with St Olaves, something that benefits the Parish, any projects for a cash injection.

There was talk about a possible civilian speed watch team, but this will have to involve liaison with the police possibly at a later date. It was further suggested that speed recording cables could be requested to be placed on the road to give us a realistic view of the speed and frequency of the vehicles, this perhaps would seem the best approach.

Cllr Chris Nash reported by letter on how fast and dangerous New Road at Fritton had become and what could be done to reduce speeding and Councillor Peter Storey also made a complaint regarding the excessive speeding on the same road.

There was an open discussion as to what action should be taken regarding the Telephone box situated in Beccles Road near to The Decoy, it is becoming more derelict with each passing month. Although the telephone is not working the system still has live wires connected, the chairman has made numerous phone calls to gain information.

There were various ideas for its use, a defibrillator project, use as a library or should it be sold. It was suggested that a questionnaire to be circulated to all houses in both villages asking views. It was also suggested that if there were enough votes in favour for the defibrillator that a guest speaker would be invited to the September meeting.

MALCOLMS NATURE JOTTINGS

Crane-flies (*Tipula paludosa*) Daddy-long-legs. Crane-flies are members of the insect order Diptera, and are true flies. They have long, thin, soft bodies, narrow wings, and very long spindly legs, which has earned them the name Daddy-long-legs. They look like oversized Mosquitoes, but cannot bite and are completely harmless. Under my microscope a Crane-fly resembles a hunchback of its thorax, from which originates three pairs of legs, its head projects forwards to form its face with two large black compound eyes, two small antennae rise from its head. Its legs are completely covered with black bristles, invisible to the naked eye. It also has a pair of black claws at the tip of each foot. The females deposit hundreds of small black eggs in the soil, from which the larvae hatch some two weeks later, and start attacking plant roots. They feed right through the winter and become fully grown the following spring. In about two weeks the larvae begin to feed voraciously on roots, especially cereals and grasses, their tough outer skin has earned them the name "Leatherjackets". Crane-flies can be very destructive in lawns. They survive best in cool wet summers and I have seen them in record numbers this year.

Caper Spurge (*Euphorbia lathyris*). This summer I discovered a large Caper Spurge growing in my back garden. Early in October I decided to remove it, this tall 120cm. (47 inch) plant which had a very thick stem proved to

be very stubborn to pull out. It is wise to take care handling it, because it has a nasty surprise in store, if you tear a leaf or break a stem, the damaged surface oozes a milky sap which is acrid and poisonous, luckily I used a sturdy pair of garden gloves. The fruit of Spurge is a capsule with three segments, each containing a single seed. At maturity the capsules suddenly split with a loud cracking noise and seeds are flung out violently, leaving only the central axis of fruit. At the base of each seed is a fleshy body known as a "Carnucle", which contains an oil irresistible to ants and they carry away the seeds. When crushed the seeds yield an oily juice can be used as a purgative- hence the common name Spurge. The sap was once used to burn off warts, this is now discouraged because the sap also burns off the surrounding skin.

Blackthorn. This autumn has been a wonderful time to pick Sloes, fruit of the Blackthorn (*Prunus spinosa*), most bushes are overloaded with berries, I soon gathered enough fruit to make three jars of liquid, not with gin but cheap whisky. I look forward to sampling a taste of this delicious liqueur this Christmas.



WARNING TO DRIVERS
