

Your Parish Council Reports

Belton with Browston Parish Council

ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING

The annual meeting of Belton with Browston Parish Council was held on May 16th with all six Parish Councillors present following recent elections along with new Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, three members of the public and the Parish Clerk Kate Ruddock, The other new Borough Councillor, Ivan Murray-Smith had tendered his apologies. Ken Botwright was unanimously re-elected as chairman and similarly Nigel Light as vice chair. The Council is registered for up to 13 members and spaces will be filled by co-option starting at the June meeting, it was decided to abolish the councillor's individual portfolio holding system and to elect members to serve on the various working parties at the June or July Council meetings following the co-



depending on pitch size, with one genuine charity stall being accepted free at each session, gates are scheduled to open at 9am for stallholders with sales from 10am.

In planning there were no objections to plans for solar panels on the old touring block, pool building, live lounge and Merry Mallard, all at the Wild Duck Holiday Park, a two storey rear extension at Decoy House, Browston Lane, removal of a conservatory and an extension at Woodlands Rise, also on Browston Lane or tree works at Belton Old Hall on Station Road South, all subject to neighbours comments. Members

options. The Parish Councils accounts and all related documents for 2022/23 were agreed and signed off with no adverse comments raised by the internal auditor.

Members confirmed plans to hold up to 14 midweek (Wednesday) car boots on the New Road sports field charging sellers either £5 or £10 per pitch

agreed to object to retrospective plans for an extension at 6 Station Road South, with concerns on grounds of fire safety in relation to it being constructed so close to the new bungalow being built on the next-door plot.

The Borough Council has approved the following, Pipistrelle Barn, Hall Farm, Beccles Road (new outbuilding for gym, swimming pool and associated plant room), Borrowdale, Sandy Lane (variation of conditions in building a timber garage to replace a brick garage) and The Pines, Beccles Road, Belton (demolition of a garden room to build a new residential annex). The Borough council has refused to give outline permission for three four bedroomed properties on land south of Manor Farm Cottage on Browston Lane, Browston. There is a new Tree Preservation order on trees at Moorlands Church of England Primary Academy

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place at the New Road Centre on Tuesday June 6th (7.30pm), details are available from the Parish Clerk, Kate Ruddock on 01493 602960 or email beltonparish@yahoo.co.uk. There are also currently a number of vacancies on the Parish Council that will be filled by co-option, details of the procedure are also available from the Parish Clerk as above.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

This year's annual meeting was held at New Road Centre on May 9th with six Parish Councillors, the Parish Clerk Kate Ruddock, Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, the Rev Rosie Bunn and six further members of the public attending.

In his report as Chairman of the Parish Council Ken Botwright covered this year's loss of funding towards Council Tax with further cuts expected, the ongoing issues of parking at Moorlands School and the news that a defibrillator will be installed between Dashwood Close and Berry Close.

He reported on the three local 'Lothingland' councils working together to produce a Neighbourhood Plan which will bear 'weight' on planning application decisions and listed the reports that have been produced to date and emphasised the costs are Government funded.

Having attended a presentation about grants from the Hornsea Three

Windfarms project he indicated that funding might be applied for to fit solar panels at the New Road Centre.

All requests for hedge cutting are met with 'no funds' however after five years of trying he did report on funding for the successful clearing of Back Lane which is part of Angles Way. No response has been received from the County Council over the condition of New Road and while more green space is required he indicated that the Borough Council in a report has proposed the removal of play equipment from Nursery Close and a focus on Bell Lane where goal posts have been installed by the Parish Council.

Councillor Botwright also reported that funds received from the sale of Belton Pit land off the A143 had been 'ringfenced' for future allotment provision in the village and in closing thanked Councillors, the caretakers, The Parish Clerk and outgoing Borough Councillors Adrian Myers and Tracy Cameron for their help and support.

Further reports were presented and filed for the New Road Centre, Village Voice, Community Choir, Poorlands Trust, Church, History Society, scouts, JGI and the JGI Wednesday drop-in Sessions.

In the public comments there was a request for Bell Lane to be cleared and maintained in the same way that Back Lane has just been cleared. The overgrown state of Belton cross roads was brought up, the chairman stated that routine cutting was imminent. It was agreed that something needs to be done about the safety of the entrance to Cherry Lane Garden Centre, Borough Councillor Carpenter (also a County Councillor for another area) said he would be happy to look into things such as this. Mr Richmond thanked Rev Bunn for allowing the church to be used for community events such as the coronation celebration. And Mr Graystone was assured that funds are available for plants at the village sign.

Burgh Castle Parish Council

There were six members of the Parish Council plus County Councillor Carl Smith, Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, two members of the public and the Parish Clerk at the Annual Meeting of Burgh Castle Parish Council at the Village Hall on Monday May 15th.

Brian Swan was re-elected chairman and Bob Grimmer vice-chair for the coming year and all other positions were confirmed, it was agreed to defer the item of co-option of one further councillor to return the Council to full strength till the June meeting. The accounts for the financial year were all confirmed with no queries raised by the Auditor and the Parish Clerk was thanked for her work preparing them.

A reply had been received from the Environment Agency who claimed that they had not received a complaint against Anglian Water about sewage flooding from the Porters Loke pumping station although Councillor Grimmer assured members that he had reported this, there has since been another incident at the same location which has been reported by the Parish Councillor moving forward Borough Councillor Carpenter offered any assistance in resolving the issues for which the Council had previously had help from former Borough Councillor Adrian Myers. Anglian Water have now assured Councillor Grimmer that their response time for incidents at Porters Loke has been reduced from 'within 24 hours' to 'within 2 hours'.

Members agreed unanimously to write to First Bus to request a cessation of the special schools route on two of the afternoon bus trips to enable Belton children to return home from Lynn Grove High School as the service had not been taken up by the pupils, at the same time it was agreed to report the lack of timetables at bus stops and the lack of service update notices being displayed when roadworks force temporary changes.

In planning there were no objections to an extension at Marsh House off High Road provided materials are in keeping with the existing. The Borough have refused to give permission for a garage behind 6 Coronation Terrace to be used for residential purposes for a family member, they have approved two applications at Burghwell Lodge on High Road (conversion of three buildings to residential properties and extensions to the actual house), conditions at Hilldrop Farmhouse (Former post office) and sensor lighting changes at Welcome Pit. County Councillor Smith reported that as a Borough Councillor, he and two colleagues had all objected to development on any of the Market Road

sites put forward for consideration in the updated Boroughwide Plan.

The condition of the High Road corner as again discussed, there were no updates from the County Council, after a discussion on what to do to tidy up the bank outside the Fort car park this was adjourned till next meeting to see if the County Councillor could fund either this or improvements to the surface of Church Loke from his 'personal' County Council budget, he had indicated that he would be willing to help if he could. The County Highways Engineer has asked contractors to return to the work near the village sign to do an improved job but they have yet to visit the site.

Members agreed to get the problem of moles in the Burial Ground attended to and agreed a contractor to get the compound gate at the site repaired.

The chairman said he was trying to arrange a site meeting with 'Heart to Heart' to find a suitable location in the centre of the village for the defibrillator that was formerly situated on the Kingfisher Holiday Park.

BURGH CASTLE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

There five members of the Parish Council plus County Councillor Carl Smith, Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, just two members of the public and the Parish Clerk at the Burgh Castle Annual Parish Meeting at the Village Hall on Monday May 15th.

In his annual report, Brian Swan, chair of the Parish Council, described highway matters as a 'nightmare' with little or nothing getting done and the need for the County to recall contractors to the works near the village sign due to the bad quality of the work. He also described relations with the Norfolk Archeological Trust as 'sour' due to issues over the site entrance and the car parking situation.

He indicated that he hoped the Parish

Council would back him in asking first Bus to stop the special afternoon service diversion for Lynn Grove High School pupils as there had been almost zero uptake by Belton pupils.

He commented on Progress with the three local parishes working together on a neighbourhood plan which will bear 'weight' in future planning decisions and especially thanked Ken Botwright chair of Belton with Browston Parish Council for the massive amount of work he has put into this, (the plans progress has been halted for the moment pending the government taking a decision on its funding in 2023/4 as this can only be applied for one year at a time.

Councillor Swan made the usual comment on planning, we had objected to some applications and had been backed by the Borough in some cases but not all although we all realise that they do have strict

guidelines to comply with when taking decisions.

In closing he thanked outgoing Borough Councillor Adrian Myers, County Councillor Carl Smith, Kate Ruddock (the Parish clerk) fellow Councillors and Garden Guardian the Councils contactors at the churchyard and burial ground and welcomed the two new Borough Councillors, Graham Carpenter and Ivan Murray-Smith saying the Council looked forward to working with them both.

The meeting went on to consider and unanimously approve a resolution which needed villagers support to make the Village Hall into a 'Charitable Incorporated Organisation', whilst this will not affect day to day running of the hall it will have a bearing on its management and legal status, Councillor Greenacre stated that this is a stage towards combining the Village Hall and the Playing field into one registered charity.

ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING

The Annual Parish Council meeting was held at Fritton Village Hall on May 18th, Mrs Hayley Carruthers and Nigel Barnes were co-opted on the council to join Stannas Bellaby (who was re-elected as chairman), Catherine Richards (elected as the new Vice-chair), Peter Storey, Rowland Dunn, John Burton, Bob Betts and John Stephens, all were present along with the Parish Clerk and one member of the public. The final place on the council will be filled by co-option probably at the July meeting. Apologies had been received from all County and Borough Councillors due to a clash of meeting dates.

The Parish Councils accounts for the 2022/23 financial year were approved, with no points raised by the councils Auditor and the necessary paperwork signed.

Former Councillor Johnson had reported that he had now had a reply from the Broads Authority apologising for their delays and saying that due to a change of policy the proposed Jubilee Bench could not now be sited at St. Olaves moorings, this correction had taken a year to come through, the clerk and Councillor Johnson had replied expressing their disappointment at the decision and members agreed to ask the villages Borough Councillors if they could do the same. It was further agreed to see if the seat could now be located at either on land at 'The Belle Inn' or the boat shop opposite.

There was still no news from County Highways on the possibility of posts around the Fritton village sign, while it was agreed to ask County councillor Annison what could be done to improve safety in the vicinity of the Cherry Lane Garden Centre after the latest and fatal accident and what had happened in relation to an offer of funding from the 'Cherry Lane' owners for this purpose. In Fritton an increased police presence has helped with the speeding issue however there are still some motorists driving at 60mph in the '30mph' limit.

Three planning applications all had the same comment from the Parish Council 'no objections subject to the views of neighbours', Fir House, Priory Road, St. Olaves (reduce three Oak trees in height by 1.5metres), Thatched Cottage, Priory Farm, St. Olaves (single storey rear extension) and St. Olaves Service Station (reduce tree crowns by up to 30% for safety reasons). The Borough Council have approved the work on the Oak Trees at Fir House and to discharge one of the conditions on the works on conversion of barns at Caldicott Hall Estate into six holiday lets. The Borough Council have refused permission for subdivision of the plot at Forestry Cottage, New Road, Fritton for one detached self-build property. There had been no news from the planning inspectorate concerning a decision on the planning application at the Decoy Tavern.

The next meeting of the Council will be at St Olaves Village Hall during July however the date is yet to be confirmed due to trying to avoid the current clash with Borough Council meeting times, it will be published in the July Village Voice, full details from Kate Ruddock, Parish Clerk on 07899 846148, e-mail fritton.stolaves.clerk@outlook.com



DOGS AND FIREWORKS

You are probably thinking now is a strange time to be talking about dogs and fireworks, they aren't happening for ages. Now is the perfect time to talk about it for that exact reason. Planning and prevention for dogs without issues or trying to treat dogs with issues should be already underway so you have enough time.

FIREWORKS GOOD STUFF HAPPENS

This is what you can be working on now and you will need to do some homework before you can begin. You will need a playlist of lots of different firework noises that can be played through a device and ideally your television as well. You will also need lots of great rewards such as snuffle mats, Kong's stuffed with food, lick mats, novel toys, puzzle games, chews etc. You will also need a haven, more on that below.

Once you have all these things in place and ready you will play the noises on your play list at a low volume for approximately 10-minutes per day whilst you provide some of the items listed about. The idea is to play it very low, so your dog doesn't notice (even if they appear fine). You will only turn the volume up every 4 days (more if needed) if your dog isn't taking notice. Over a period of weeks (or months for dogs with sensitivities) you will gradually increase the volume. Once you have play it loudly you are ready to begin playing through a TV and sound system to try and replicate the environmental boom that is felt with some fireworks. Please note, if your dog already has noise sensitivities there are many more steps and other elements you will need to implement.

BUILD A HAVEN

In the middle, inner most part of your house create a haven for your dog and train them to lay inside. A crate makes a great haven as blankets and towels can be draped over to make it feel like a den. Place a really comfy bed inside and even a t-shirt you have worn so your scent is there for your dog to lay on.

PREVENTION TIPS

There are a few things you can do to try and prevent issues with fireworks occurring. Exercise your dog well during the day of fireworks night and fireworks season so they have burnt off extra energy. This also avoids walking at dusk or night when they will happen. Walking dogs when fireworks are going off will not help them get used to it and the sudden bangs, whooshes and pops can be so startling it might affect them for life. Reduce noise during fireworks season by closing all windows and curtains. Keep the television on high and aim to have music or white noise on in as many rooms as possible to drown out the fireworks. If all this still doesn't help your dog reach out to a professional for extra guidance.

A word from your Local MP & Councillor



BRANDON LEWIS MP writes



When I was first elected to Parliament the new Chancellor of Exchequer had to make difficult decisions to restore economic stability following the last disastrous years of Gordon Brown's premiership. In last month's Budget a new Chancellor, making his first Budget statement, outlined how our country had avoided recession. And how growth is set to return following the hard decisions the Government took to restore economic stability following the uncertainties of the pandemic and Putin's illegal war in Ukraine.

I'm delighted to see the Government focussing on economic growth, by providing further child care support for working families and boosting business investment to create new jobs. These are just some of the measures announced in the Budget. It's impossible to detail all the minutiae in this column but I have highlighted some of the most important announcements from a Great Yarmouth point-of-view.

Help for parents with young children

Many constituents tell me about the challenges of juggling a growing family with work commitments and how the availability and cost of childcare is a barrier for parents, particularly mothers, returning to work. The most important announcement in the Budget was the package to help families in that position. Extending 30 hours of childcare a week to working parents of children aged 9 months to 4 years is a big move that will make an enormous difference. And helping those on Universal Credit with upfront childcare payments direct to providers rather than payment in arrears will help with household budgets and cost of living pressures.

Help with household energy bills

The Energy Price Guarantee has provided vital support for households as they faced even higher energy bills in the aftermath of Putin's invasion of Ukraine. Many were worried that despite the prospect of reducing bills later in the year, following the reduction in wholesale energy prices, the end of the guarantee in April would have left people facing higher bills in the short term. Extending the guarantee for a further three months is a sensible move that will protect households until energy bills do start to fall in the summer.

Continued help for pensioners

Many assumed the Government would ditch the Triple Lock Guarantee, which has protected the state pension for over a decade. The Chancellor confirmed that the guarantee remains in place meaning the state pension will increase by 10.1% in line with inflation. It's the biggest increase in the state pension ever. And because we continue to take tough decisions when it comes to economic policy, other pensioner benefits – winter fuel payments, free bus passes and free prescriptions – remain in place.

Down the Garden Path

with Elizabeth Myhill

Whilst traditionally shrubs were nearly always planted between November and March these days they are being cultivated in large pots they ready for transplanting straight into the border at most times of the year. This has several advantages for those who want an interesting garden but don't have the time or interest to look through endless gardening books to choose from. However, Books I would recommend the Dr. D.G.Hessayon series of books The Evergreen Expert, The Tree and Shrub Expert available on the internet for just a few pounds. Sadly Dr Hessayon has retired and will not be writing anymore gardening books. These are simple and straightforward and although many varieties have been improved over the years the basic information is sound and easily understood. (Other gardening books are available!)

Advantages of buying now

- Generally speaking, not many of us spend time in the garden between November and March.
- In the Spring it is easier to see what has survived the winter and where space is available.
- Garden centres should be well stocked and have a wide choice of shrubs available.

Decide if your soil is acidic, neutral, or alkaline. If you don't know then look to see what kind of shrubs are growing in the surrounding gardens or you can buy a soil testing kit. If you want to grow an Azalea or Rhododendron then why not grow it in a large container using ericaceous compost.

I have chosen three easy to grow and suitable for the soil and situation locally the first being *Choisya Brica* which has fragrant white flowers and lime yellow evergreen leaves. Suitable for sun or light shade.

Escalonia Pink Ellen Not fussy about soil type sun or light shade. Flowers June to July, Evergreen. Makes a good hedge tolerates salt laden air.

Photinia fraseri 'Red Robin', from New Zealand after World War II. Grows in any reasonable soil, thrives best in full sun. Can grow to 8ft. Newer varieties are Louise which has variegated leaves, new growth shows off pink and red. Very hardy and suitable to form a hedge

fraseri 'Magical Volcano' is a new upright variety of photinia which has blood red growth on serrated edge leaves. Its intense colour and upright habit lends itself well to make an excellent hedging choice


