

# Your Parish Council Reports

## **Belton with Browston** Parish Council

The September meeting of Belton with Browston Parish Council was delayed until the 19th when all eight current Parish Councillors were present along with Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, County Councillor Carl Annison, five members of the public and the Parish, Clerk Kate Ruddock,

Members accepted the resignation from the Council for personal reasons of former chairman, Ken Botwright, David Mills was subsequently voted in to chair the Council whilst Nigel Light remains as vice-chairman.

There was only one issue advised in matters arising, the general condition of roads and verges in the village although the person who had contacted the council did not mention any specific locations and in the public session the only question asked as one concerning street lights and the answer will be sought by Councillor Carpenter to see why lights that are automatically switched off at midnight now come back on considerably later than the 5am when they used to automatically turn back. Councillor Annison said that he has asked for slow signs and 'Farm traffic' markings to be placed at specific locations on New Road to make drivers aware of turning farm equipment. Members agreed in principle to arrange for a pressure wash clean of all the villages bus shelters.

The payment of bills for August and September was confirmed and the clerk reported very good income for the period and also the financial success of the car boot sales which had been taking place on Wednesdays, it was agreed that these had performed far better than expected and there were calls from councillors for them to go ahead again in 2024, this time with better quality signage, it was explained that the basic notices were used as Council did not want to spend much money in case the sales were not a success. Finally on finance, members agreed to invest their reserves in a one-year fixed term with the Cambridge and Counties Bank, this was something that the council used to do until the recent very low interest rates had made the process not worthwhile.

There was a discussion on replacement of the showers heating



switch' as soon as the current heating system gives up. The only other issue regarding New Road was vandalism to the corner of the perimeter fence, it was agreed to look at specifications for a stronger

mesh based product at the October council meeting.

In Planning there were no objections to works at 55 Station Road South to raise the level of the roof to allow for more accommodation in the roof space. The Borough Council have approved work on an Oak tree covered by a Tree Preservation Order at Moorlands School and all the following Belton Scout hut on Marsh Lane (extensions), Manor Barn, Browston (side extension and link to main building),15 Minsmere Road (extension/conversion to garage and pitched roof) and 6 Station Road South (retrospective approval of side extension).

The next meeting of the Parish Council takes place at the New Road Sport and Leisure Centre on Tuesday October 3rd (7.30pm), details from the Parish Clerk, Kate Ruddock on 01493 602960 or e-mail beltonparish@yahoo.co.uk. There are still vacancies on the Council that con be filled by co-option, full details from the Parish Clerk on the contact details above.

# Burgh Castle Parish Council

here were six members of the Parish
Council plus County Councillor Carl Smith,
Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter, one member of the
public and the Parish Clerk at the September 11th Meeting of
Burgh Castle Parish Council at the Village Hall, Brian Swan was in
the chair.

In planning there were no objections to a two-storey extension at Crows Farm on High Road or to a revised plan to reduce the size of the previously approved rear extension at 5 Holly Terrace on Church Road. The Borough Council had refused plans for a front extension at 4 Louis Dhal Road and a request to alter windowsills at Burghwell Lodge on Market Road. A new Tree Preservation Order has been placed on five Oak trees on the east side of Mill Road.

Councillors agreed to go to tender for improvements and tidying up of the two shrub beds at the Parish Burial ground where the mole catcher has been asked to take another look at the ongoing problem also the next of kin will be contacted where appropriate about graves where extra vases and other items have been placed away from headstones.

Regarding highways matters County Councillor Carl Smith confirmed that orders have been placed for work, expected to take place later this year, to put posts outside the front of the Roman Fort entrance to stop parking on the bank, he also confirmed that the full resurfacing of Crows Farm corner on High Road will take place, hopefully in November/December and that a total road closure will be needed for a few days for the work as the whole surface is to be cut back. Borough Councillor Graham Carpenter said that 'Warning-beware of horses' signs will be placed at each end of Back Lane.

With the start of the new school term members are still concerned about the loss of the afternoon return bus services to Yarmouth and Gorleston to allow the bus to return pupils from Lynn Grove High School to Belton, they will monitor the usage of the trips for this purpose before taking any further action however they were pleased to see that after much chasing, and with the help of ENTUA, there are now a good supply of up to date timetable boards at village bus stops.

Concerns were raised over the lack of maintenance at the Roman Fort however due to recent changes there it was agreed that no action will take place till after next month's Council meeting, the Norfolk Archaeological Trust will be contacted again

#### **DOGS AND SEPARATION ANXIETY**

Dogs are known for their loyalty, affection, and unwavering companionship. However, this loyalty can sometimes result in separation anxiety when they are left alone. Separation anxiety is a common behavioural issue in dogs, characterised by distress and destructive behaviour when



they are separated from their owners. This condition not only affects the dog's well-being but can also be challenging for the pet owner. Fortunately, there are various strategies and techniques that can help alleviate separation anxiety in dogs, promoting a happier and healthier relationship between pets and their human companions.

#### UNDERSTANDING SEPARATION ANXIETY

Before addressing separation anxiety, it's crucial to recognise the signs and symptoms and understand why this might be happening. Separation anxiety is just the label used which isn't actually very helpful. The emotion experienced by the dog is fear of separation from the main caregiver. This is often routed in the attachment style the dog has to the main caregiver which is why for some it can happen in certain environments or why it might only happen in relation to one person.

Common indicators of separation anxiety in dogs include excessive barking, howling, whining, destructive chewing or scratching, house soiling, and attempts to escape. These behaviours are often triggered when the dog realises that their owner is about to leave or has already left. This means that even picking your keys up, or putting your shoes on can trigger a reaction. Why? Because the dog has learned these are cues you are leaving them. Understanding that these actions stem from anxiety rather than deliberate disobedience is the first step in helping your beloved friend.

#### GRADUAL DESENSITISATION APPROACH

One effective method for treating separation anxiety is gradual desensitisation. This involves teaching your dog that being alone is not a traumatic experience. Start by leaving your dog alone for short periods and gradually increasing the duration as they become more comfortable. Offer treats or toys that they enjoy creating positive associations with alone time. Reassure your dog that you'll return by keeping initial departures extremely short and following a very strict incremental increase in time.

#### **COUNTER CONDITIONING APPROACH**

Counterconditioning is a behavioural training technique that replaces negative associations with positive ones. When your dog exhibits signs of anxiety, engage in activities that they enjoy,

such as playing, offering treats, or utilising a cue they can already do well. This redirects their focus away from their anxiety and towards positive experiences. Gradually, this can help them build confidence and reduce their anxiety when alone.

#### ADEQUATE STIMULATION

Regular exercise and mental stimulation can help reduce anxiety levels. Before leaving, engage your dog in a vigorous play session or a long walk. Puzzle toys and treat-dispensing devices can also keep their minds occupied and ease their anxiety during your absence.

#### **COMORBID BEHAVIOUR ISSUES**

This condition is usually linked to other behaviour issues, the most common being issues to noises. If your dog is reactive to noises this will also need addressing to improve the prognosis of overcoming the separation anxiety.

#### **MYTHS IN APPROACH**

Quite often owners are advised to either punish the dog for reacting when they are gone or to crate train their dog. Punishing a dog for being fearful and anxious will lead to more fear and more anxiety which may be displayed in a different behaviour issue. Utilising a crate might help for some dogs, but this does not address the underlying emotion driving the behaviour and just restricts their movement further. This can cause a bigger reaction and achieve the opposite of what the caregiver is aiming for.

#### **CONSULT A PROFESSIONAL AND BE CONSISTENT**

In cases of separation anxiety, it is a really good idea to seek professional help from a qualified behaviourist. Alternatively, have a chat with your veterinary surgeon so they can guide you in the right direction. A professional can provide guidance on behaviour modification techniques and, if needed, will work with your veterinary surgeon who can prescribe medications to alleviate the dog's anxiety. Medications should only be used under the guidance of a veterinary professional after a complete behaviour assessment has been conducted by a regulated behaviourist.

The key to helping dogs with separation anxiety is consistency and patience. Consistently practice the techniques that work for your dog and be patient as they gradually become more comfortable with being alone. Understand that progress may be slow, but with your love and support, your furry companion can overcome separation anxiety and enjoy a happier, more relaxed life

Separation anxiety in dogs is a common and challenging issue, but with the right approach and a lot of dedication, it can be managed and even overcome. By understanding the signs, using gradual desensitisation, tweaking your relationship, providing exercise and mental stimulation, and seeking professional guidance, when necessary, you can help your dog feel more secure and content when left alone. Your efforts will not only improve your dog's well-being but also strengthen the bond between you and your dog.





# **Neighbourhood Plan Update**

We are in the process of developing a Neighbourhood Plan for Belton with Browston, Burgh Castle, Fritton and St Olaves. This will be used to help determine all future planning applications in our area.

We have finally received the grant funding from Government, albeit three months after it was due. The Neighbourhood plan is progressing nicely and we have completed the following reports:

Housing Needs Assessment report, Design Guidance and Codes report and the Consultation (Questionnaire) report.

#### The following reports are close to completion:

Evidence Base report, Views report, Local Green Spaces report and Non-Designated Heritage Assets report.

We have just produced the first draft of the actual Neighbourhood Plan, (based upon the above reports) this is a work in progress, hoping to finalise this within the next two months.


As reports are completed, they will be posted on the three Parish Council websites, click on the link 'Neighbourhood Plan' and scroll

As required by the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations we will be consulting on the draft plan for a period of 6 weeks. This will likely take place in November/December, so look out for this and the events we will be running at the time to make people aware of what the neighbourhood plan includes. Once we have completed this consultation, we will consider all the feedback and make final changes to the plan before submitting it to Great Yarmouth Borough Council and the Broads Authority. It will then be their responsibility to consult again and take the plan through formal examination. This will be undertaken by an independent examiner who will ensure the plan meets the legal requirements and basic conditions.

If successful at the examination stage, with modifications if necessary, then the local authority will arrange for a neighbourhood plan referendum. If there is a majority yes vote, then the neighbourhood plan is made and becomes part of the statutory development plan for the area.



The sessions will include the essential exercise moves to keep our muscles & bones strong to help us through our daily activities and also will focus on improving our balance, good back health and



Calocephalis brownie

Here are a few more perennials that will enhance the pansies, and violas (see September Village Voice) to grow in containers or winter flowering pots this season.

Calocephalis brownie is a hardy 'Silver Thread' plant that's an ideal choice for seasonal planters having its unique form, and texture. Great to use combined with other plants to provide a

contrast in form and colour, from Heucheras to Black Ornamental Grasses it goes well with pansies and violas. Forming a small mound of ghostly silverywhite twisted foliage and stems. This plant almost resembles a clump of smoke-coloured deep-

sea tropical coral.

Heuchera Carnival Series Cocomint, Granita. Burgundy Blast, Ideal for container planting especially in shade. Deer resistant, winter hardy, heat



tolerant. Provide valuable colour in winter and produce dainty flowers in summer that attract bees.

Heathers (Calluna vulgaris) are a low-growing perennial shrub 20-50cm tall found naturally growing across moorland and heath. They require ericaceous compost so unless you have acid soil they are best grown in containers.

#### **ENTUA AGM**

ENTUA held its AGM at Christchurch, Deneside on Wednesday 16th August, 2023. In his annual address ENTUA President Mike Taylor stressed the importance of retaining staffed ticket offices at railway stations and the availability of paper timetables. He said Community Rail Partnership had provided rail timetables for the Wherry Lines and smaller bus operators had produced timetables, but larger operators have not. He also identified James Paget Hospital as a location needing a revamp of its bus shelter facility and a new entrance for buses.

#### **ENTUA PUBLIC MEETING**

ENTUA's public meeting followed the AGM and was well attended.

Greater Anglia Manager – Alan Neville reported that all local suburban and main line services within the Greater Anglia Network were being operated by new trains. Two new stations were being built, one at Cambridge South (this will be handy for Addenbrookes Hospital) and the other at Chelmsford Beaulieu Park. Passenger numbers were now at 90% of pre-pandemic levels overall and actually higher on some local routes. Mr. Neville dealt with many questions, notably from passengers concerned about proposed closure of railway ticket offices, but also regarding problems with ticket vending machines.

First Eastern Counties Manager Chris Speed addressing the meeting said that passenger numbers were at 97% of pre-pandemic levels on some local routes and some of this is due to the current £2.00 single fare cap which is helping to win back passengers. The new Service 7 which operates from Gt. Yarmouth to Norwich via Caister, Filby, Fleggburgh, Acle, Broadland Business Park, Norwich Railway Station and Castle Meadow had attracted a considerable number of passengers in the first month and the company was receiving useful feedback from these passengers.

Among points raised at the meeting was for a Saturday Service 7, a regular bus service to Gapton Hall Retail Park and for some bus services to be routed over the Herring Bridge.

#### £2.00 Single Fare Cap

A reminder that the £2.00 single fare cap remains in force until 31st October, 2023. From 1st November, 2023 the single fare cap rise to £2.50 and will remain in situ for 12 months until November, 2024. As previously stated it is possible to travel from Belton to Norwich for £2.00 and back for £2.00. A £4.00 return trip, excellent value for money.

#### Discounted Weekly, Monthly and Group Ticket in Norfolk

With effect from Sunday 3rd September, 2023 First Eastern Counties are offering a 25% discount on all their weekly, monthly and High 5 Group tickets in all of their fare zones within Norfolk. This great saving will make bus travel even more affordable for regular travellers or when you want to head out with family or friends for a fab day out by bus.

All Adult and Young Person weekly, monthly and High 5 tickets are included in the following zones;

Norwich Zone, Norwich Inner Zone, Coastal Zone, Explorer Zone, Excel Zone and Great Yarmouth Town Zone. You can also enjoy the discount on their weekly, monthly and High5 Network tickets and the multi –operator NORFOLK FUSION GROUP DAY TICKET.

#### **Examples of the discounts are:**

- 1. Weekly Adult ticket Gt.Yarmouth Town usually £20, with discount = £15 (a weeks worth of travel for £15)




