# Parish Council Reports

Monthly Reports from all your Local Parish Councils Belton, Browston, Burgh Castle, Fritton & St Olaves

# Belton with Browston Parish Council

The latest monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on September 2nd with ten Parish Councillors present along with ten members of the public and the Parish Clerk. David Mills was in the chair.

A number of residents were present to back up concerns raised by e-mail at the three planning applications currently being considered by the Borough Council for Browston Hall which include a new leisure and hospitality facility with ten pin bowling, golf, snooker and 50 luxury lodges, also requested on site are a further 32 holiday lodges and infrastructure. Councillors agreed to again object to all three applications, substantially unchanged from the original plans from 2022 and 2024 with a long list of objections and concerns and a request that all three applications be totally refused.



In other planning Members agreed to submit no objections to plans for a single-story extension at 2 Broom Gardens. a single-story rear extension at Tudor Lodge on Browston Lane, demolition of a garage and extension at The Bungalow on Browston Lane and build a twostory side extension (including garage), plus a two-story rear extension and a front porch extension. There was an application for a roof height increase to a recently approved extension at 23 Paddock Close. Belton, also no objections to a retrospective application for a rear extension at 19 Bramble Gardens. Members did however object by a 6-3 majority, to subdivision of the plot at 1 Rosedale Gardens for a detached 3 bedroomed house on the grounds that this would be too large for the plot.

Planning applications

approved by the Borough

Council were:- 19 Bramble Gardens (retrospective permission for a rear extension), High House, Lound Road,

Browston, work to trees covered by a TPO), 3 Amhurst Gardens (single story rear extension) and 74 Fern Gardens (removal of timber shed and construct a single width garage). The following have been withdrawn by the applicants, Beech Farm Barns, Beccles Road, (change siting and orientation of cart shed) and 19 Bramble Gardens (application for lawful use of single-story sun room/conservatory attached to the side extension).

In a written report County Councillor Carl Annison stated that he hopes that details for a suggested safety scheme for the road at Stepshort should soon emerge from the Highways Engineer.

Parish Councillor Comer reported that the Village Voice magazine is looking to put on a fun day in August 2026, the chairman of the Village Voice, Adrian Myers had reported that there is an appetite for this event and the New Road site will allow for an expansion on the 2024 event. members confirmed that the event could be held at New Road and that all, except the first Saturday in the month in August 2026 are currently available.

The Clerk reported that she had received an e-mail with pictures of parking on the grass in Berry Close, it was agreed to pass this on to the Highways engineer, it was noted that there are other roads with the same problem and it was agreed to ask the Engineer if he would work with the Council to identify possible additional parking areas.

The next council meeting will take place on Tuesday October 7th, commencing 7.00pm at the New Road Sports and Leisure Centre details from the Parish Clerk, Kate Ruddock on 01493 602960 or e-mail clerk@beltonwithbrowston-pc.gov.uk.

There are still two vacancies on the Parish Council that can be filled by co-option, full details from the Clerk, details as above.

#### LOCAL COUNCIL REORGANISATION

Local Borough Councillor and vice chair of Great Yarmouth Borough Council Carl Smith gave an outline of the latest position on local government reorganisation as it applies to the Borough Council at the September meeting of Burgh Castle Parish Council.

During September the Borough Council, along with five of the other local councils published their reorganisation plans which consist of three unitary councils, one based in Kings Lynn for the west of Norfolk, one based in Great Yarmouth for the east and an extended 'Greater Norwich' as a central ring whilst Norfolk County Council favours one unitary authority to run the whole of Norfolk and South Norfolk have yet another idea , two councils, Norwich and East Norfolk along with West and North Norfolk.

Future expected dates are as follows.

**November 2025** - early 2026- This and other proposals to be put out to public consultation by the Government.

May 2026 - Election for a single Mayor to cover all of Norfolk and Suffolk.

**May 2027** - Shadow unitary Council elections to take place (to run in tandem with existing Councils)

**April 1st 2028** - The 'shadow' authorities to take over control.

Whilst Borough District and County Councils face change Parish Councils will stay unaltered at this time.

# Burgh Castle Parish Council



The September 8th meeting of the Council was attended by all six Parish Councillors, County Councillor Carl Smith, the Parish Clerk and two members of the public, Brian Swan was in the chair, planning Members accepted resignation of Councillor Bob Grimmer and will write to thank him for his long service to the Council, Wendy Griffiths was elected to fill the position of vice chair of the council.

The Chairman confirmed that, with no offers to take over maintenance of the flower beds by the village sign he will get them cleared and grassed over with the daffodil bulbs left to come through annually. County Councillor Carl Smith reported that plans are going ahead for a bus shelter outside Cherry Tree Holiday Park and he is still trying to get the Millfields Footpath cleared, the chairman stated that the nettles are very high and the spoil heap is still in place as well as the trees that belong to the adjacent holiday park now

also needing cutting back.

Councillor Smith reported that all roadside gullies in the village are scheduled to be cleaned out.

There was one new application, majority members agreed to object to proposals for an increased height front wall as out of keeping with the area, and a side extension as over development of the site at Tittlemouse on Butt Lane, members did not object to the trimming back of a large oak tree at The Grange Lodge on High Road and noted that the Borough Councils refusal of the application for an upwards extension to Burghwell Lodge on Market Road was being appealed against by the applicant.

The next Council meeting will be on Monday October 13th at the Village Hall, on Church Road commencing at 7.00pm, for details contact Kate Ruddock, the Parish Clerk, on 07899 846148, e-mail clerk@burghcastle-pc.gov.uk.

#### **Pumpkin Soup Recipe**

Serves • 6 Easy • Prep: 20 mins • Cook: 25 mins

#### Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 2 onions finely chopped
- 1kg pumpkin or squash, peeled, deseeded and chopped into chunks
- 700ml vegetable stock or chicken stock
- 150ml double cream

#### For the croutons

- · 2 tbsp olive oil
- · 4 slices wholemeal seeded bread crusts removed
- handful pumpkin seeds Method

step 1 Heat 2 tbsp olive oil in a large saucepan, then gently cook 2 finely chopped onions for 5 mins, until soft but not coloured

step 2 Add 1kg pumpkin or squash, cut into chunks, to the pan, then carry on cooking for 8-10 mins, stirring occasionally until it starts to soften and turn

step 3 Pour 700ml vegetable or chicken stock into the pan and season with salt and pepper.

Bring to the boil, then simmer for 10 mins until the squash is very soft.

step 4 Pour 150ml double cream into the pan, bring back to the boil, then purée with a hand blender. For an extravelvety consistency you can pour the soup through a fine sieve. The soup can now be frozen for up to 2 months.

step 5 To make the croutons: cut 4 slices wholemeal seeded bread into small squares.

step 6 Heat 2 tbsp olive oil in a frying pan, then fry the bread until it starts to become crisp. step 7 Add a handful of pumpkin seeds to the pan, then cook for a few mins more until they are toasted. These can be made a day ahead and stored in an airtight container.

step 8 Reheat the soup if needed, taste for seasoning, then serve scattered with croutons and seeds and drizzled with more olive oil, if you want.

September always makes me nostalgic. The leaves sweeping underfoot, the sharp chill of early mornings that mellow into sunshine by midday, the satisfying crunch of acorns scattered across the school field. My mind slips easily back to childhood: cold walks to school, rucksack straps digging into my shoulders, and that flutter of anticipation in my chest for the start of a new year.

Back then, September smelled of new shoes and fresh exercise books. It was the season of sharpened pencils and shiny lunchboxes, of wondering who you'd sit next to and whether the teacher would be strict. September carried the thrill of new beginnings — clean slates wrapped in autumn air.

Even now, the season still stirs the same anticipation, but now it's mixed with something else: anxiety. Not for me, but for my children. September belongs to them now. The excitement of a new term has shifted from my world to theirs — and I carry the waiting, the watching, the hoping.

Of course, it was different when we were at school. There were no mobile phones, no family apps, no digital bus timetables glowing in our pockets. Our parents couldn't track our every movement. We had long walks in the rain, forgotten homework, missed buses, and the less than occasional detour to the sweet shop. The anxieties were different then — smaller in some ways, sharper in others —

but nothing like the constant low-level hum of worry that technology both feeds and soothes for parents today.

Most afternoons, I open the family app and watch the little dot that tells me where my eldest is. I see it move faster as

he rides the bus home, then creeping closer as he walks the last stretch. I flick between cooking dinner and glancing at the screen, checking again and again as if my watching could make him come quicker. Every so often I peek through the curtains, half-hoping to catch sight of him turning the corner of the road. It's only when I finally see him there that I feel the knot in my chest loosen and I can breathe properly again.

It's in those moments I think of the father in Jesus' parable of the prodigal son. When I was younger, I focused on the son — the rebellion, the homecoming, the celebration. But now, as a parent, I find myself caught by the father's side of the story. The endless waiting. The horizon-watching. The ache of love that keeps you hoping for a glimpse. I understand him better these days. Love makes us wait.

And September is a season of waiting too. Nature itself is shifting. Trees let go of their leaves in a final blaze of gold, as if to remind us that beauty can be found even in the act of surrender. There's always a sadness in it—a reminder that nothing stays the same forever. Children grow. Routines shift. Life turns a page.

The writer of Ecclesiastes puts it like this: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." Ecclesiastes 3:1. A time for holding hands, and a time for letting go. A time for walking with them to the classroom door, and a time for pretending not to when they roll their eyes. A time for watching the bus inch across a map, and a time for trusting they'll be just fine without your hovering.

But it's not just about letting go of our children. Sometimes, it's about letting go of ourselves. Our need for control. Our desperate clutch on certainty. Our plans and expectations of how life should look. Like the trees surrendering their leaves, we too are called to release what we hold tightly — so that God has space to move. Letting go is rarely easy, but it makes room for grace.

So, September remains for me what it always was:



a season of anticipation. The difference is, now it carries both nostalgia and hope. As I crunch through leaves, check the family app, and sneak glances through the curtains for the first sight of my son at the corner of the road, I'm reminded that each season has its beauty. Autumn whispers that letting go is part of love. Parenting shows me that waiting can be sacred. And faith assures me that God is with us in every change — in the chill of morning, in the warmth of afternoon, and in that longed-for moment when the ones we love come home.

o plant fruit trees, first choose a sunny, welldrained spot and prepare the planting area by removing incorporating weeds and compost. Next, soak the tree's roots, then dig a wide hole, and place the tree in it, ensuring the graft union (if present) is above the soil line. Water well once planted. Finally, add a layer of mulch, keeping it away from the trunk, and secure the tree to a stake with a flexible tie.



The best time to plant fruit trees is in the autumn as-well as hedging.

#### Cox Orange pippin apple

Wonderful flavour, excellent crunch and juicy. They are Self fertile which means they do not need to have another apple tree nearby to produce fruit.

#### Jonagold apple

They are best for cooking, baking, fresh-cut into salads, applesauce or just eating out of hand.

#### Conference pear

Conference pears have a balanced, sweet taste that develops from slightly acidic when firm to a rich, honey-like sweetness when fully ripe. They



have a juicy, non-gritty texture that ranges from a satisfying crunch to a soft, buttery, melting consistency, depending on ripeness.

Conference pears are self fertile so they do not require a pollinator.



#### Stella cherry

The Stella cherry can become very dark red, offering a sweet, satisfying taste perfect for fresh eating and other uses.

Stella cherry tree does not require other trees for pollination which makes them perfect for limited garden spaces.

#### Victoria plum

A Victoria plum tree typically



starts producing a small amount of fruit in its second or third year after planting. Victoria plums have balanced flavour of sweetness with a touch of tartness, and they are particularly juicy and flavourful when fully ripe.

Victoria plums are self fertile.

For the last 34 years, the care of the School and garden has been in the capable hands of Mr. and Mrs. Burrage. In gratitude for their outstanding work, they were presented with a handsome tea and dinner service in Poole ware.

At the last day of School, the children took part in a thanksgiving Service, and farewell gifts were presented to Mrs. Jack (flowers and a book token); book tokens were given also to her colleagues Mrs. Parker, Mrs. Shepherd, and Mrs. Skipper the School secretary for 16 years, with thanks and appreciation for the service they all have rendered.

Of the children, 3 go to places at Yarmouth Technical High School, other 11 year olds to Lothingland Modern School, and the rest go on to the delights of the new Waveney School at Belton. Mrs. Jack will also be teaching there for the first term.

The future of the two school buildings in the village has still to be decided, but the village certainly needs to have a village hall, and now seems to be the appropriate time to consider the responsibilities entailed in getting one. The site of Bowgin's School legally reverts to the heirs and successors of those who gave it: the Old School or Institute is on a different footing and does not revert. I understand that the Parish Council is considering what can be done.
